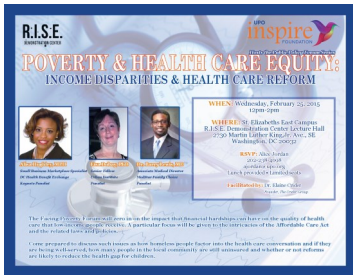


(Free) Tuesday February 24, 2015 9:30AM-1:00PM: DISB Economic Inclusion Series
